Emil Wagner operated a hollow block factory here. Wagner had a patent for a collapsible form for concrete in 1913.

From 1919 -1942 Philip Gardner had a Shoe Repair Shop. Equity Dairy came next. In 1962 Fort Recovery Oil Association distributed Marathon gasoline and fuel oil. They sold Dean and Barry paint as well. In 1966 they erected a new building which stands today. The oil company was here until the early nineties.

Then Neal Muhlenkamp, CPA, used this office before moving over to his place of business on Wayne Street. Phil Wood opened a t-shirt shop. Dr. Carr had his chiropractic practice here before moving to Broadway Street.

From 2012 and in business today, Lisa Roessner's Crafty Corner sells crafts, baked goods, and children's wear with Lisa and family making many of the handcrafted and baked items.
